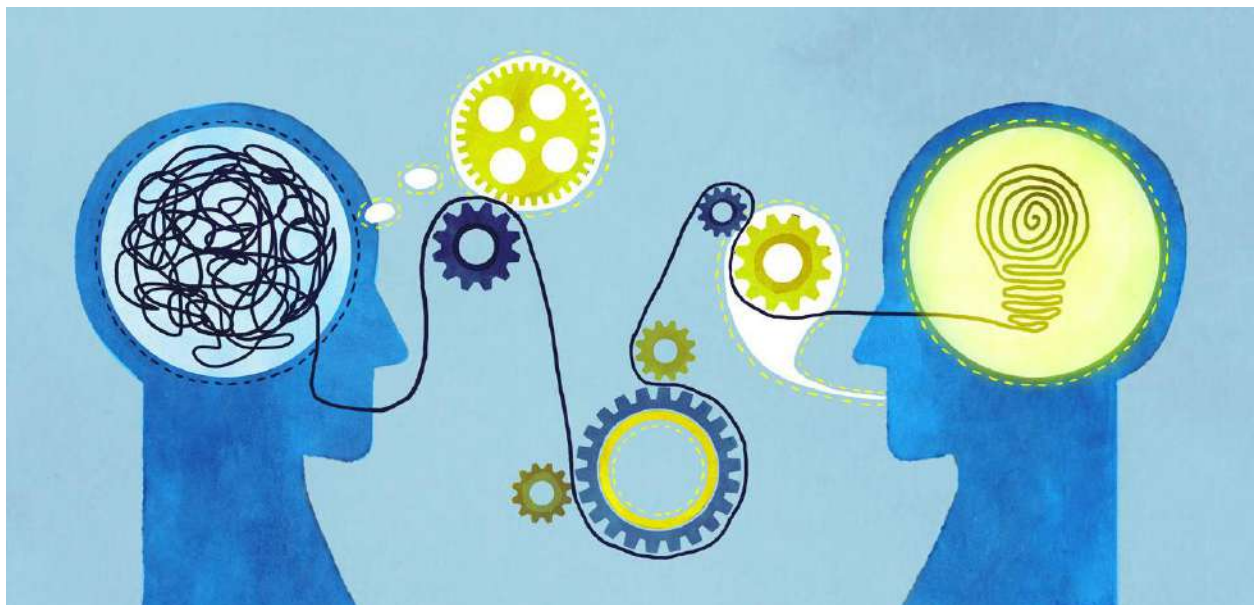

About the organization: Ismail National Mahila Post Graduate College (INM P.G.) aims to educate and empower women through professional and academic higher education.
